A Stewardship Letter

Why Church?

Recently I was asked "why church?" by someone who had grown up without organized religion and wanted to understand why someone would invest their time, talent, and treasure within a faith community. My reflexive answer, borrowed from St. Augustine, was "because our hearts are restless until they rest in God." Raising an eyebrow my friend replied, "Even if that was self-evidently true, it still does not answer the question. Clearly it is possible to encounter the Divine Presence outside of church."

In struggling to explain, I found myself using the needs-based language I've learned through the practice of Non-Violent Communication (NVC). NVC posits that all behavior is an attempt to meet universal human needs. Explicitly naming the needs we are seeking to meet through our actions creates greater understanding between us. So, here is an (abbreviated) list of the needs I told my friend are met for me through participation in Christian community.

Shared Reality: As a community we believe different things, but we share an understanding that there is 'Something More' that gives life meaning beyond our individual identities and experiences. We share a commitment to following in the way of Jesus. Self-Expression & Contribution: Church was where my leadership skills were first named, noticed and nurtured and where I was encouraged to claim and use my voice.

Effectiveness: Through church I am part of a collective body that has the power, through our actions and advocacy, to bend the arc of the moral universe towards justice a little quicker and more effectively than my individual efforts alone.

Challenge: Church challenges me to align my behavior with my values and beliefs, holding me lovingly accountable to being my most authentic self.

The list goes on: **compassion, celebration, belonging, beauty, inspiration, connection** . . . There is no community that will meet all my needs all the time. But during this season of stewardship as I reflect on what value the church has in my life, I am grateful for how many of my needs are met consistently through my engagement with the United Church of Christ. And, equally important, how investing my time, talent, and treasure in this community of faith provides the opportunity to contribute to meeting the needs of others.

The Reverends Reflection

Like Rev. Bauman, I am also frequently asked, "Why church?". The question comes most often from my LGBTQ friends who have been so wounded by the church. The pain may have been inflicted in their childhood or when they came out or even as an adult seeking spiritual guidance navigating the complexities of being gay in a world that rejects who they are. Instead of receiving support, the church has brought more rejection. I understand their reluctance and skepticism to associate with an institution which criticizes and judges instead of loves. Sadly, the judgement is not limited to the LGBTQ community. I have heard many stories in my career about how the church has failed to embody the love Jesus preaches. It breaks my heart when I hear about the pain and damage the church has caused. That's why I am so grateful for the United Church of Christ and specifically for Hope UCC.

We understand the role of the church is to stand for justice, to spread love and to be the body of Christ in the world. We follow Jesus and Jesus mission is to bring the kin-dom of God near. In the kin-dom of God, no one feels abandoned. Everyone is respected, accepted, celebrated and loved. In the kin-dom of God there is enough food, enough health, enough wealth and enough love for everyone. And we work diligently to bring God's kin-dom into reality.

I appreciate the needs-based language Rev. Bauman used to express her commitment to the church; *Shared Reality, effectiveness, challenge, compassion, celebration, belonging, beauty, inspiration, connection* . . .

All those qualities she described are why I am connected to a church but there is more. Church not only meets my needs and the needs of the congregation but it's also important what we do in the world. We come to church because we find friendship and inspiration and we take care of each other but more importantly, we care for the world. Our ministries and witness touch lives of people we may never meet. At Hope UCC, everything we do is to further Jesus' mission of filling the world with the love of God.

This far-reaching love is why I come to church. This mission is why I give. This ministry is why I pledge. Join me, won't you?!


Note: This order is for physical gift cards only. More to come on eCard options next year.

A note about Offering Envelopes....


As you may know, last year's budget was a 'bare bones' budget. As a consequence, one of the items cut was the purchase of new pledge envelopes for 2022. It was decided to use envelope boxes which had not been used (gone unclaimed) the previous year.

Currently, we have <u>only 25 boxes</u> which we have placed in the narthex. What the Stewardship Committee is hoping is the people will carefully consider if they truly need to use the envelopes to submit their weekly or monthly pledge contribution.

If you donate with a check, a pledge envelope is not necessary because your donation can be easily recorded by your name. Only persons who donate in cash truly need envelopes in order to record your donation. You may use any envelope, as long as your name is on it. You can even use leftover envelopes from last year.

Unfortunately, once the envelope boxes are gone, there are no more. Since many people have been donating electronically, we hope the savings far outweigh any inconvenience.

Hope UCC Hosting a Blood Drive: November 6, 2021

The Growth & Development Committee has set the Fall blood drive date with the OneBlood organization in Rockledge for Saturday November 6, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The Big Red Bus will be parked in the circle in front of the church.

<u>Everyone</u> who is eligible is urged to participate! OneBlood staff will determine if you are eligible when you check in. There are a few instances where a person may not donate and you can find those on the website: oneblood.org There will even be a "thank you" gift for those donating blood!!

To donate blood, you must be in good health, 16 years of age (16-year-olds need a completed and signed Parental Consent Form) or older, and weigh a minimum of 110 lbs.

Covid-19 Information:

- Beginning August 1, 2021 OneBlood is requiring all donors to wear a mask, regardless of their vaccination status.
- During the registration process to donate blood, your OneBlood phlebotomist will ask you if you received a **COVID-19 vaccine**, which vaccine you received, and when you received it. The FDA requires that these questions be asked to determine donor eligibility. If you do not know the answers, you will not be able to donate. To simplify the process, you can also bring your COVID-19 vaccination card and show it to your phlebotomist.

After more than a year of testing all donations for the COVID-19 antibody, on June 29, 2021 OneBlood made the decision to stop COVID-19 antibody testing.

Pre-donation suggestions:


Drink plenty of water prior to donating.

Eat a light healthy meal. Avoid fatty foods. Donating blood on an empty stomach is not recommended.

Eat iron rich foods a few days leading up to your blood donation. Your iron levels must be at a certain level in order to donate blood. We will check your iron count prior to your blood donation and if it is too low you will not be able to donate blood that day.

There is no cost to the church but we are asked to have at least 10 donors committed to donate prior to the blood drive. You may **choose a time-slot** which is at 15 -minute intervals, ex. 9:15 a.m., 9:30 a.m., etc. You may register a time slot with oneblood.org or email Betty Capaldo at bcapaldo31@gmail.com or text Betty at 401-323-7041 with your desired donation time. Walk-in donors are also welcome. Thank you!

Book Club November 2021



In November, the Hope UCC Book Club will read and discuss, <u>The Henna Artist</u> by Alka Joshi. This is a novel about freedom and independence in India, following independence from Britain. In its portrait of one woman's struggle for fulfillment in a society pivoting between the traditional and the modern, <u>The Henna Artist</u> opens a door into a world that is at once lush and fascinating, stark and cruel. Escaping from an abusive marriage, seventeen-year old Lakshmi makes her way alone to the vibrant 1950s pink city of Jaipur. There she becomes the most highly requested henna artist - and confidante - to the wealthy

women of the upper class. But trusted with the secrets of the wealthy, she can never reveal her own.

In addition to an intriguing storyline, the reader learns about the Indian culture, including the caste system, how to make henna, cultural superstitions and food recipes.
