The Reverends Reflection

Lent is a season of contemplation. We reflect on the life and death of Jesus. In our Lenten worship series, Good Enough, we have been reminded that we don't need to be perfect because we are good enough just as we are. In a society that displays power, success and riches, we remember that instead of climbing ladders of success, we can tend gardens and nurture ourselves and others. It's nurturing that helps things grow. God loves us when we achieve greatness and when we are living our ordinary lives. God loves us even in our imperfection.

The cross has become a symbol for followers of Jesus. The cross is a reminder of Jesus' execution by the Roman Empire and points to the empty tomb and resurrection into new life. He is risen! Alleluia! Happy Easter! Let's pause for a moment and remember that before the joy of alleluia comes Holy Week with all the complex emotions the week stirs up in us. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday and the joy of a parade waving palms and shouting Hosanna! Jesus is here! But there is more to this parade then just announcing Jesus' arrival. This parade is not sanctioned by the local government. No permits were pulled. There is no police escort leading Jesus' donkey. The government sanctioned parade is on the other side of town with a great display of military might. The palm parade is an act of subversion against the oppressive, violent, and cruel Roman rule.

Jesus understands the danger his alternative parade announces. On Thursday he gathers his friends with him, and they eat together. Jesus humbles himself in service and washes the disciples' feet. In an act of great love, service and generosity Jesus communes with his friends.

What if the table became our symbol for what it means to follow Jesus? We nurture each other with love, nourishment, and inclusion. We have dinners of resistance against the powers that threaten injustice. We build community in the face of dangerous violence in the world. In a world of hate, violence and selfishness, we build tables of kindness, justice and love. That sounds like new life to me.

Alleluia! Happy Easter!
