The Pastor's Ponderings . . .

My muscles are still sore from lifting the Christmas decorations into storage as we begin preparations for Lent. Ash Wednesday on February 22nd begins the season of Lent. Has the calendar always advanced so quickly or is it the perspective of my advancing age? Whatever the reason, the season of Lent is nigh. I am excited to introduce another worship series from Worship Design Studios by Marcia McFee.

Lent is a time for pondering the meaning of the Christian story, the meaning of faith and the meaning of love. We hear the stories that lead Jesus to Jerusalem and to the cross and we experience his suffering, death and resurrection. We reflect on our own lives and how we respond to God's call in our lives.

We are all looking for love...love in our own life, love for others and love in the world. The Lenten worship series is called, *Looking for Love*. Here is how Worship Design Studies introduces the series:

The Christian scriptures offer many images of where love, grace, forgiveness, righteousness, and healing can REALLY be found. And it is not in the "usual" places. Isn't it as true of us today as it was of the scriptural authors? Don't we often look for wholeness and happiness in places that offer only temporary "good feelings" and satisfaction? Lent is a wonderfully reflective time to reassess where we are searching for meaning and purpose. We'll move through stories of Jesus to find out who offers the "real deal."

February Festivities

Here is what Rev. Karen is up to:

Rev. Karen continues to focus on creating meaningful, hybrid worship services that deepen faith and inspire us to fill the world with more peace, more justice, and more love. She has begun planning Ash Wednesday, Lent and Easter services in coordination with the Music Director and Deacons Committee. The Lent theme is "Looking for Love in All the Wrong Places". Theology on Tap has resumed with a video series from Tripp Fuller, Homebrewed Christianity with John Dominic Crossan. The series provokes lively conversation among the 9 people in attendance on Zoom. Rev. Karen also continues to meet with people for pastoral care needs in person and remotely as needed. She has had 10 Pastoral Care meetings in January.

January 17th was the National Day of Racial Healing. "On this day, individuals, organizations and communities across the U.S. come together to explore their common humanity and build the relationships necessary to create a more just and equitable world" (from National League of Cities). Rev. Karen joined Peggy Hayes at an event sponsored by the Humanity Task Force for Racial Justice. The gathering was a diverse group of people engaging in conversation about what racial healing means to them. It was an enriching experience that will hopefully be the beginning of many more conversations in the future.

January ended with the sad news of the death of a beloved patriarch of the church, Lee Keillor. The memorial service was held in Hope UCC's sanctuary with a reception in the Social Hall.

Rev. Karen continues to participate in several groups connected with the Florida Conference including Community of Practice for Clergywomen, Sacred Conversations to End Racism (SC2ER) and the Antiracist ministry team. Rev. Karen also serves on the Board of Directors as chair of the Nominating Committee for the Florida Conference and has been newly appointed to the Committee on Ministry and the Planning Committee for the Annual Meeting. Rev. Karen also participates in an ecumenical weekly Lectionary Group through Faith Lead at Luther Seminary. Rev. Karen is beginning to make plans for a Church wide conversation about the future of Hope UCC with the Florida Conference Staff.



Book Club February 2023



In February, the Hope Book Club will read and discuss "The Genius of Women: From Overlooked to Changing the World" by Janice Kaplan.

We tell girls that they can be anything, so why do 90 percent of Americans believe that geniuses are almost always men? New York Times bestselling journalist and creator and host of the podcast The Gratitude Diaries, Janice Kaplan explores the powerful forces that have rigged the system - and celebrates the women

geniuses, past and present, who have triumphed anyway. Even in this time of rethinking women's roles, we define genius almost exclusively through male achievement. When asked to name a genius, people mention Albert Einstein, Leonardo da Vinci, and Steve Jobs. As for great women? In one survey, the only female genius anyone listed was Marie Curie. Janice Kaplan sets out to determine why the extraordinary work of so many women has been brushed aside. She makes surprising discoveries about women geniuses now and throughout history, in fields from music to robotics. Through interviews with neuroscientists, psychologists, and dozens of women geniuses at work in the world today including Nobel Prize winner Frances Arnold and AI expert Fei-Fei Lishe proves that genius isn't just about talent. It's about having that talent recognized, nurtured, and celebrated. Across the generations, even when they face less-than-perfect circumstances, women geniuses have created brilliant and original work.

In "The Genius of Women," you'll learn how they ignored obstacles and broke down seemingly unshakable barriers.
