

The Reverends Reflection



It's no secret that the church has been changing. Attendance is not what it was back in 1976 or even 1990. Our Sunday School rooms have been repurposed and Sunday morning soccer games compete with Sunday morning worship. Some experts refer to this time of change as an *Awakening*, or a spiritual revolution, or maybe another reformation or a secularization of society. Some just say the church as we know it is irrel-

evant and is dying. Fortunately, our faith teaches us that after death comes new life and Hope United Church of Christ is full of new life! We are looking forward to a vibrant future. But how do we get there?

Neal Watkins, Minister for Congregational Life from the Florida Conference is guiding us to discern what our future could look like. In the first visioning session (July 30th), we focused on who we are as a congregation and what we do well. We went over the survey results and discovered that we are all very different but share a love of Hope UCC and the community it creates. The survey showed that everyone agrees, Hope UCC is about caring, acceptance, justice and love. We also talked about the elephant in the room and realized that "bringing in more young people" is not the answer to a sustainable future. The era of "If we build it, they will come" has ended for the church. Bright shiny buildings and youth activity rooms no longer hold the key to success or a guarantee of a prosperous future.


Neal reminded us that it's important to know **who** we are, **what** we do, **how** we do it and **why** we do what we do. He posed important questions for discussion. Such as: What challenges in the world/community is Hope UCC uniquely positioned to speak/serve towards? There were stimulating discussions at each table about the opportunities and challenges Hope UCC faces. We discussed who benefitted the most from what Hope UCC offers.

The next session on **August 20th** will focus on the questions, "Who is my neighbor?" and "What is Beloved Community?" and ultimately, "Why do we do what we do?". We are working to clarify our purpose and our mission.

I don't know what the future looks like, but I know Hope UCC will be a part of it! God is calling Hope UCC to vital work in the world. We follow Jesus into a future that brings hope, peace, justice, and love to all. We can work together to bring God's dream for the world into focus. In God's world everyone has enough, everyone is respected, honored, and loved for who they are, and ALL creation is cared for. The Kin-dom of God is for everyone! Together, we can reveal God's dream of a just world for all! Let's get busy!

Hope 'N Heart Thrift Shop

Hope 'N Heart Update

Hope 'N Heart thrift shop opened in February and has been opened each month on the second and third weekends of each month. To date we have raised over \$8,000 for the church through thrift shop sales and online sales. There have been many volunteers helping to create Hope 'N Heart, from cashiers, people who work behind the scenes for pricing and organizing donations, people who create advertisement for the shop, people who take the church trailer out to pick up or deliver donations, bakers who have contributed baked goods for sale and people who have donated many wonderful items to fill the thrift shop. Two to three Fridays are workdays behind the scenes whereby we gather in the church's social hall and price items, process through all donations to assure the clothing is clean, electronics work, and items are within date for sales. We usually choose several items each month to feature on online sales. During our Friday workdays we usually select what items will be listed as a special sale in Hope 'N Heart, i.e., bag of books for \$1.00 or bag of clothing for \$3.00.

We average 50-75 customers each day we are open and have a good group of "regulars" that look forward to shopping each weekend we are open. We have made good friends through Hope 'N Heart, created close and strong relationships with Hope UCC volunteers as we work together, and we have had thrift shop shoppers join Hope UCC through our outreach to customers.


Hope 'N Heart was developed and begun by several of us dreaming about ways to raise money for Hope UCC. Karen and I created a business plan, presented it to the Council and it was approved to go forward. We have always known that Hope 'N Heart, though always close to our hearts, was not "our" thrift shop, that Hope 'N Heart belongs to Hope United Church of Christ. Karen and I had presented in our business plan that we would manage and get the shop up and running successfully in the first year. The shop is well on its way to being remarkably successful. Because Hope 'N Heart belongs to our church (not Karen and Mell) at the end of 2023, we will be ready to turn the management of Hope 'N Heart over to our congregation.

We are beginning to ask about, talk about and look for more volunteers from our congregation of those people that would like to take on the responsibility of continued success with Hope 'N Heart.

We have between the present time and the end of 2023 to train volunteers in all the ways to continue the shop AND we plan to continue to volunteer our time also. We need a person or a group to step up to the management portion of running the store, recruiting volunteers, pricing, and organization of donations, and working with Hope UCC Treasurer regarding accounting measures. Online sales provide a large part of the financial success of the shop. A volunteer will be needed to manage the online sales which involve photographing items, listing on local sites, being familiar with online sites and selling and meeting customers at church for final sales.

Hope 'N Heart is and will continue to be an important financial part of Hope UCC's yearly budget needs and just as importantly a strong part of our local community in service to shoppers. Please pray for Hope 'N Heart as we move forward to the end of 2023 and the beginning of a fruitful transition from what began as a simple idea and has developed into a positive church and community experience.
