Merry Epiphany!

I know that's not a common thing to say but maybe we should! Epiphany is an underrated church season. Epiphany is when we seek God's revelation through Jesus. The wise men followed the light of a star to lead them to baby Jesus in the manger. Let's all be wise ones searching for Jesus! And how about if we too follow a star to deepen our faith....

Hope UCC has a tradition of picking a Star Word or a Star Gift on Epiphany Sunday. Let me remind you what a Star Gift is. The use of star words, also called "star gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year that has been growing in popularity in Protestant churches for nearly a decade now. The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written or printed on paper. I believe that the Holy Spirit gives you the perfect word as a guide and message for the new year. I encourage you to place your star word someplace where you will see it regularly throughout the year to allow consistent reflection on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word. What message is God revealing to you through this word?

Here are a few ideas of how to use your star word for daily prayer:


- Look up the definition of your word, even if it is a word you know well. You may even look into the etymology of the word and how its meaning has changed throughout history. If you drew a non-English word, do as much research as you can into the meaning of the word in its original culture.
- What does this word remind you of? Does it recall any memories or experiences? How might God be speaking to you through this word?
- See if you can find your word—or a synonym—in the Bible. What scripture passages can you find? How is the word used in these passages? Are there other scripture passages that remind you of your word?
- Write or speak aloud a prayer using your word. (This is a fun challenge for children using the star words.)

The Magi followed a star, which ultimately led them to Jesus. May your star word also lead you to Jesus and to feel closer to God and enrich your faith. May 2023 be a year filled with faith, fun and love!

Book Club

For the month of January, the Hope Book Club will discuss the book read in December, <u>You Don't Know What War Is</u> by Yeva Skalietsky and the January selection, <u>Master Slave Husband Wife</u> by Ilyon Woo.

The December reading is a memoir, in diary form, of 12-year-old Yeva, a Ukrainian girl who lives with her grandmother in Kharkiv. She studied English at school and has written this record of how her family escaped the bombings. Yeva's diary entries begin on her birthday, 10 days before the war starts. Yeva describes how she and her grandmother seek safety across Ukraine and beyond. She describes her fear and panic as she hears explosions and sees missiles and tanks. Yeva doesn't witness any violence toward people, but she mentions casualties and a person who was killed by a bomb. The book includes a few black-and-white photos, including one of a bombed-out apartment building and others showing the destruction of Yeva's bedroom and kitchen in the apartment where she lived with her grandmother, neighborhood kids playing in a basement shelter, and happy photos of her before the war and after she finds refuge and a new school in Ireland. This is a short book and an easy read.




Book Club

The January reading is an account of an amazing enslaved couple who fled from Macon, GA in December, 1848. The wife, Ellen, who passed for White, disguised herself as a wealthy disabled man, with her husband, William accompanying her as "his" slave. They not only made a brilliant plan, but carried it off perfectly. No hiding, or fleeing at night, they rode openly on public transportation to Philadelphia, then Boston. They joined the abolitionist lecture circuit and, because of their public speaking, were forced to flee from the United States in 1950.

Every part of this book has been authenticated and shows a true love story along with a challenge, even today, to our belief in life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.






