

'Tis the Season...

Yes, the Christmas season has already begun. Is anyone else wondering how it got here so fast? Advent begins December 3rd.

Advent is the liturgical season when the church gets ready for Christmas. The word *advent* comes from the Latin word for *arrival*. 





Congregational Meeting






